

City of Rittman (Allen County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase two power loads and one cot to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. The City of Rittman Emergency Medical Service provides EMS to the City of Rittman and a portion of Milton Township.

Delphos dba Delphos Fire Department (Allen County)

BWC approved \$36,761 to purchase three power cots to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Delphos Fire & Rescue Department provides first response ALS and BLS transport services for Van Wert and Allen Counties.

Wayne Township, Auglaize County (Auglaize County)

BWC approved \$35,395 to purchase one power cot, two stair chairs, and one power load system to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Wayne Township Fire and Rescue covers rural Wayne Township and is also contracted to cover the Village of Waynesfield.

Bridgeport Equipment and Tool (Belmont County)

BWC approved \$32,571 to purchase two movable loading ramps to potentially reduce the risk of injury to back, shoulders, neck, arms, and legs due to sprains, strains, pushing, pulling, and lifting. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the amount of physical force needed to load, unload, and move merchandise during the loading/unloading process. Bridgeport Equipment and Tool is an equipment rental and retail sales company.

Cumberland Trail Fire District #4 (Belmont County)

BWC approved \$37,800 to purchase three power cots with accessories to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Cumberland Trail Fire District offers EMS which includes transporting emergency patients to the hospital, rescue operations, educational opportunities, and public educational outreach programs on health and related issues.

Erb Electric Co. (Belmont County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase two electric scissor lifts and two hydraulic trailers to potentially reduce the risk of injury or strain to the hands, wrists, back, neck, elbows and shoulders related to repetitive motion, awkward postures and fall from heights. This intervention will improve the overhead lighting and wiring process. Erb Electric Co. is an electrical construction company that specializes in low voltage to high voltage wiring in the commercial, industrial, and residential markets.

Smith Township Volunteer Fire Co. (Belmont County)

BWC approved \$30,631 to purchase a powered load system and a powered cot to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting by reducing repetitive lifting. The Smith Township Volunteer Fire Company is located in Southeast Ohio and provides EMS services to its residents.

TAC Industries Inc (Clark County)

BWC approved \$12,271 to purchase three lifts, one bed, one mattress, 12 slings, and four platform tables to potentially reduce the risk of injury to back, shoulders and neck related to bending, twisting, repetitive motion, hands force, contact stress and awkward postures. The purpose of the intervention is to improve the process of patient maneuvering and positioning. TAC Enterprises is a non-profit organization that provides life skills, meaningful employment, and housing connections to enhance the lives of people with disabilities.

Louiso Trucking, Inc (Clermont County)

BWC approved \$24,975 to purchase two tarp sectional systems and one electric roll tarp system to potentially reduce the risk of injury to back, neck, shoulders, arms, and wrists due to pulling, bending, twisting, and awkward postures. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the risk of injuries associated with manually tarping inclement weather and reduce the physical strain associated with manually tarping trucks. Louiso Trucking is a regional transportation company.

Covington Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation (Columbiana County)

BWC approved \$8,288 to purchase a booster device, hands truck, laundry cart, mopping system, walking harness rotation disc and a mini scissor lift to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to repetitive motion awkward postures, hands force, contact stress, push/pull heavy load and manual material hands load. This intervention will improve the patient care and facility maintenance process. Covington is a skilled nursing and rehabilitation facility located in East Palestine, Ohio. Covington offers 65 beds short term and long term care for patients as well as out patient therapy.

Michael Norkus dba Norkus Orchards (Columbiana County)

BWC approved \$30,585 to purchase 300 bins to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to awkward posture, kneeling, twisting, bending, repetitive motion, lifting, contact stress and hands force. This intervention will improve the apple harvesting process. Norkus Orchards is a 70 acre farm located 3 miles Southwest of Salem, Ohio. Norkus Orchards produces as much as 25,000 bushels of apples each year.

Galion Pointe LLC dba Galion Pointe (Crawford County)

BWC approved \$39,623 to purchase 29 hi/low beds, 29 pressure mattresses, two bariatric beds, a standup lift, patient lift, bariatric shower, and shower chair to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the hands, neck, wrists, shoulders, back and legs related to repetitive motion, hands force, awkward postures, contract stress and push/pull heavy load to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to awkward posture, kneeling, twisting, bending, repetitive motion, lifting, contact stress and hands force. This intervention will improve the process of physically moving patients and the bathing process. Galion Pointe is a skilled nursing and rehabilitation facility. Galion Pointe provides long term care, as well as short term rehabilitation and provides clinical needs of patients who require 24-hour nursing care.

Container Compliance Corp (Cuyahoga County)

BWC approved \$5,396 to purchase a scissor lift to potentially reduce the risk of injury or strain to the hands, wrists, back, neck, elbows and shoulders related to repetitive motion, awkward postures and fall from heights. This intervention will improve the light changing and roof repair process. Container Compliance is an industrial packaging reconditioning facility. Container Compliance's service includes collection of dirty containers, cleaning of containers, and delivery of newly reconditioned containers.

Olmsted Township (Cuyahoga County)

BWC approved \$23,290 to purchase two power cots with accessories and one compatibility kit to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. The Olmsted Township Fire Department is the sole provider of fire suppression and EMS for Olmsted Township.

Del-Co Water Company Inc (Delaware County)

BWC approved \$15,874 to purchase four sets of box panels, two end panels, eight spreaders, 16 adjustable spreader assemblies, two stacking kits, two leg kits, and two lifting slings to potentially reduce the risk of injury to back, neck, shoulders, arms and potentially the whole body due to bending, lifting, twisting, and collapse of trench. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the risk of trench collapse and allow workers to safely operate below ground level while performing necessary water line repairs. Del-Co Water Company, Inc is a private non-profit drinking water supplier maintaining four water treatment facilities and an extensive distribution system.

Trimen Inc (Delaware County)

BWC approved \$39,746 to purchase hydro jet system to potentially reduce the risk of injury to back, neck, shoulders, arms, and lower extremities due to lifting, bending, pushing, pulling, slips, trips, falls, and awkward postures. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the need for lifting and moving heavy equipment and reduce the slip, trip, and fall hazards. Trimen Inc offers a wide variety of services for plumbing and repair, including cleaning main sewer and septic lines.

Quarry Hill Orchards LLC (Erie County)

BWC approved \$30,892 to purchase 300 bins to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to repetitive motion, hands force, awkward postures, contact stress, manual material hands and environment. This intervention will improve the manual material hands process. Quarry Hill is a small family fruit farm consisting of 130 acres of apples, peaches, plums, pears and nectarines.

Fritz-Rumer-Cooke Co Inc. (Franklin County)

BWC approved \$35,761 to purchase various hydraulic tools to potentially the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to awkward posture, vibration, contact stress, hands force manual material hands load and push/pull heavy load. This intervention will improve the railroad track-work process. Fritz-Rumer-Cooke Co. is a private railroad track construction and maintenance contractor, who works for several railroad companies and many industrial clients that own in-plant railways.

Lifeline Mobile Inc (Franklin County)

BWC approved \$12,562 to purchase a scissor lift to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to awkward posture, kneeling, twisting, bending, repetitive motion, contact stress and fall from heights. This purpose of the intervention is to improve employee safety while providing vehicle maintenance. Lifeline Mobile Inc manufactures custom mobile health vehicles for various health and mobile outreach applications.

McNeil Group Inc. dba Pinnacle Metal Products (Franklin County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase four cranes and a hoist to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs, and back related to slips, trips, fall from heights and sprains. This intervention will improve the manual material hands process. McNeil Group Inc. dba Pinnacle Metal Products provides steel fabrication, design and erection of material.

Suburban Steel Supply Co LLC (Franklin County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase three battery operated cart motors to potentially reduce the risk of injury or strain to the hands, wrists, arm, shoulders, legs and back related to repetitive motion, awkward postures, manual material hands and push/pull heavy loads. This intervention will improve processes inside the fabrication shop. Suburban Steel is a small company that offers a full spectrum of services related to residential and commercial structural steel, rebar, and miscellaneous metals.

Burton Volunteer Fire Department Inc (Geauga County)

BWC approved \$10,413 to purchase one power cot to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. The Burton Volunteer Fire Department provides fire and EMS services for the Village of Burton, Burton Township and half of Claridon Township.

IMS Company (Geauga County)

BWC approved \$8,868 to purchase a reel to reel winding and cutting machine to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, fingers, hands, neck back and legs related to repetitive motion, awkward posture, bending, contact stress and push/pull heavy load. This intervention will improve the manual cutting, winding and packaging process. IMS Company is a diversified distributor of specialty and common MROP products, and a highly specialized manufacturer of mechanical and non-mechanical auxiliary equipment. IMS Company provides multiple industries with custom replacement parts, repair and refurbishing services, design/build/fabricate capabilities, along with a broad scope of mechanical engineering capabilities.

The Guernsey County Community Development Corporation (Guernsey County)

BWC approved \$20,692 to purchase one portable four column lift and one power pusher to potentially reduce the risk of injury to back, wrists and shoulders due to bending, twisting, and awkward positions. The intervention will potentially reduce the need to manually lift heavy vehicles off the ground and reduce the amount of pushing, pulling and awkward positions. The Guernsey County CDC is a 501c3 organization that hands a variety of projects that require the usage of large equipment.

Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$39,592 to purchase a fall arrest anchor point system to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the upper and lower extremities related to fall from heights. This intervention will improve rigging, scenery and lighting process. The Cincinnati Playhouse professional theatre company located in Cincinnati, Ohio. The Playhouse is a not-for-profit corporation that is a 626-seat Marx Theater which stages six productions with over 200 performances annually.

Frey Electric Inc (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$26,888 to purchase two scissor lifts to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to awkward posture, kneeling, twisting, bending, repetitive motion, contact stress and fall from heights. This purpose of the intervention is to reduce the use of ladders while providing maintenance and repairs. Frey Electric Inc is a residential and commercial electrical contractor.

Givaudan Flavors Corporation (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$10,158 to purchase three loaders to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to hands force, awkward postures, contact stress, push/pull heavy load and manual material hands. This intervention will improve the manual material hands process. Givaudan is a fragrance and flavor company that creates and manufactures taste and smell solutions.

Givaudan Flavors Corporation (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$29,841 to purchase a uniform erector/sealer to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs and back related to repetitive motion awkward postures, contact stress, push/pull heavy load and manual material hands load and frequency. This intervention will improve the fabrication process. Givaudan is a fragrance and flavor company that creates and manufactures taste and smell solutions.

J. Beischel Electric (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$39,102 to purchase wire pulling equipment to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, neck, shoulders, hands, legs, and back related to awkward posture, bending, repetitive motion, contact stress, push/pull, hands force and manual material hands, heavy load and frequency. This intervention will wire pulling process. J. Beischel Electric is a commercial electrical contractor located in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Morrow Gravel Company (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase a pedestal mounted breaker to potentially reduce the risk of bodily injury or death, related to fall from heights, struck by and occupation exposures. This intervention will improve the boulder crushing process. The Morrow Gravel Company is a mining company that provides both limestone and sand and gravel to customers that include: construction companies, state, county, and municipal entities, local residents and agricultural operations.

OK Interiors Corp (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$37,796 to purchase one stationary board cutting table, one sawing unit, two milling units, one vacuum, one glue gun, one metal stand for glue gun, one handheld milling machine, and one vacuum hose adapter to potentially reduce the risk of injury to hands, wrists, arms, and shoulders due to cuts, sprains, strains, and repetitive motion. The purpose of the intervention is to prefabricate as many sections of drywall as possible, before installation, thus reducing the need to manually hands heavy board and reduce the amount of manual cutting of the board. OK Interiors Corp is a company of specialty interiors and acoustical contractors offering services to commercial, industrial, and construction sites.

Paramount Lawn Services Inc. dba Paramount Lawn + Landscape Inc. (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$23,023 to purchase a mini skid steer to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, shoulders, hands and back related to awkward postures, repetitive motion hands force and heavy load. This intervention will improve the lawn maintenance process. Paramount Lawn and Landscape, Inc. is a full service lawn and landscape company that provides services to the Greater Cincinnati Area and Northern Kentucky. Paramount provides landscape design and installation, full landscape maintenance, installs sprinkler systems, landscape lighting, water features, plants, paver patios, retaining walls, and more.

Village of Lockland (Hamilton County)

BWC approved \$35,400 to purchase one power cot, one stair chair, and one power load system to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Lockland Fire-Rescue Department is the primary provider of fire, rescue, EMS, and other life safety/technical rescue services for the Village of Lockland.

Village of Cadiz (Harrison County)

BWC approved \$32,769 to purchase one trailer mounted boom lift and one hydraulic breaker to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to awkward posture, kneeling, twisting, bending, repetitive motion, contact stress and fall from heights. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the need to use ladders while performing maintenance and reduce the need for employees to physically chip and break up concrete and rock. The Village of Cadiz provides maintenance and services for roadways, streetlights, and numerous buildings for the village.

309 Monroe Inc dba Firelands Fab (Huron County)

BWC approved \$9,825 to purchase one crane to potentially reduce the risk of injury to back, neck, shoulders, arms, and legs due to sprains, strains, lifting, bending, and twisting. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the need to physically move, carry, or lift any of the welded assemblies thus limiting the exposure to muscle injuries and reducing the risk of dropping the completed assemblies. Firelands Fabrication is a structural steel fabricating business that fabricates approximately 1500 tons of structural and miscellaneous steel each year.

Lake Erie Construction Company (Huron County)

BWC approved \$10,166 to purchase an under bridge inspector to potentially reduce the risk of bodily injury or death, related to fall from heights. This intervention will improve the street, guardrail and fence repair and installation process. Lake Erie Construction is a Heavy Highway Construction Company located in Norwalk, Ohio. Lake Erie Construction is a specialty contractor whose operations include the erection of guardrails, high-ways signs, chain link, vandal and farm fence, installation of pavement markers, sod, see and mulch.

Village of Mingo Junction (Jefferson County)

BWC approved \$11,555 to purchase one cot, one loading system, and one hydraulic breaker to potentially reduce the risk of injury back, neck, shoulders, arms, and lower extremities due to repetitive motion, lifting, bending, and twisting. The purpose of the interventions is to improve the process of patient hands and lifting and reduce the need for employees to physically chip and break up concrete and rock. The Village of Mingo Junction provides EMS, water, sewer, and other services to the residents of Mingo Junction.

City of Eastlake (Lake County)

BWC approved \$36,172 to purchase three cots to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. The City of Eastlake Fire Department provides EMS, hazmat, technical rescue services and dive services to the City of Eastlake and the Villages of Timberlake and Lakeline.

Career & Technology Education Centers of Licking County (Licking County)

BWC approved \$35,141 to purchase a boom lift to potentially reduce the risk of injury or strain to the hands, wrists, back, neck, elbows and shoulders related to repetitive motion, awkward postures and fall from heights. This intervention will improve general maintenance and electrical repair processes. Career and Technology Education Centers of Licking County is a Technical High School/Adult Education Facility serving 700 High School students and 3,000 Adult Education students.

Harry & David Operations, Inc (Licking County)

BWC approved \$17,964 to purchase 40 conversion kits, one tilt table, and four adjustable work benches to potentially reduce the risk of injury to hands, fingers, back, neck, shoulders, and lower extremities due to bending, twisting, repetitive motions, and awkward postures. The purpose of the intervention is to convert current non-adjustable tables to adjustable, and reduce the need from associates to bend, lean, and twist during production. Harry & David Operations, Inc is a multi-channel operation that includes direct marketing, stores distribution, wholesale, production and receiving operations.

Polymer Technologies & Services Inc. (Licking County)

BWC approved \$40,000 purchase a screen changer to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the upper and lower extremities related to awkward postures, hands force, repetitive motion, manual material hands and occupational exposure. This intervention will improve the manual screen changing process. Polymer Technologies and Services, Inc. manufactures commodity and engineering grade thermoplastic resins from post consumer materials.

West Licking Joint Fire District (Licking County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase three diesel exhaust extraction units to potentially reduce the risk of exposure to potentially harmful exhaust fumes. This intervention will improve the emergency vehicle exhaust expelling process. West Licking Fire District is a public service organization that provides fire suppression, emergency medical response, heavy and light rescue, hazardous material response, and participates in several county incident management teams.

Fligner Enterprises Inc (Lorain County)

BWC approved \$30,375 to purchase a poly-clip, automatic double-clipper system to potentially reduce the risk of injury to neck, shoulders, hands, wrists, and fingers due to cuts, sprains, strains, and repetitive and continuous motion. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the physical force, exertion, and repetitive motions needed to twist, clip, and tie product for the next stages of processing. Fligner Enterprises is a sausage and smokie manufacturer and wholesaler.

City of Ashtabula (Lucas County)

BWC approved \$32,192 to purchase one power cot with accessories and one power load system to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Ashtabula City Fire Department provides fire and EMS services covering 9 square miles.

Oregon Fire/Rescue Department (Lucas County)

BWC approved \$31,958 to purchase three power cots with accessories and installation to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Oregon Fire/Rescue Department provides fire and EMS for the residents of the City of Oregon.

Woodsage Holdings LLC (Lucas County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase 11 sound curtains and 11 top cover curtains with ventilation to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the body related to occupational exposures. This intervention will improve the swaging process. Woodsage Industries, LLC specializes in custom steel tube, bar cutting and bar fabrication.

Allstate Exteriors, LLC (Madison County)

BWC approved \$40,000 purchase one articulating boom lift to potentially reduce injuries due to falls from elevated positions. This purpose of the intervention is to reduce the use of ladders while removing and replacing gutters, carrying shingles to roof, replacing siding and windows, and providing other services and repairs that require working from an elevated position. Allstate Exteriors, LLC is a general contractor company providing commercial and residential general, contracting services.

Prime Plumbing & Mechanical Inc. (Madison County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase a sewer jetter system to potentially reduce the risk of injury to the wrists, elbows, shoulders, neck, fingers, hands, legs and back related to repetition, hands force, push pull, contact stress, awkward postures and push/pull heavy loads. This intervention will improve the sewer and septic clean-out process. Prime Plumbing & Mechanical Inc. is a small plumbing, heating and cooling repair company.

Beaver Township Fire Department (Mahoning County)

BWC approved \$12,332 to purchase one power cot and one stair chair to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Beaver Township Fire Department provides fire protection and EMS to the residents of Beaver Township.

Brunswick City School District (Medina County)

BWC approved \$10,794 to purchase scissor lift to potentially reduce the risk of injury or strain to the hands, wrists, back, neck, elbows and shoulders related to repetitive motion, awkward postures and fall from heights. This intervention will improve the general maintenance and custodial processes. Brunswick City School operates one high school, three middle schools and seven elementary schools, with a total enrollment of 7,550 students.

Township of Granger Ohio (Medina County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase two power cots and two lift systems to potentially reduce the risk of injury related to repetitive motion, and manually lifting and loading/unloading patients into and out of emergency vehicles. This intervention will improve the process of patient hands and lifting. Granger Township Fire and Rescue provides fire and EMS for approximately 25 square miles in Medina County.

DMAX LTD, LLC (Montgomery County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase two electric torque tools with one balancer and one tool hands to potentially reduce the risk of injury to shoulders, hands, and neck due to repetitive motion, awkward postures, and contact stress. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the vibration, sound pressure, trigger pressure, and any variation in torque that is currently experienced during production. DMAX LTD, LLC produces turbo diesel engines for Chevrolet and GMC.

Mancor Ohio dba Mark Concepts (Montgomery County)

BWC approved \$40,000 to purchase two fender hands devices, two air balancers, and one jib crane to reduce the risk of injury to back, neck, shoulders, knees, and arms due to lifting, pushing, pulling, and repetitive motion. The purpose of the intervention is to reduce the amount of manual lifting and flipping of the fenders and should increase the productivity and quality as the risk for scratching and dropping the fenders should be reduced. Mancor Ohio is a fabricator and provider of aluminum and steel components and subassemblies to the heavy duty trucking industry.
